#### SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT U.S. EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDERS. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30.00 SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES. 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS; 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.
- 3. THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Committee, consisting of the Competition Manager, the Horse Show Secretary and the USEF Steward.
- 4. ALL ENTRIES are accepted with the understanding that the Santa Barbara National Horse Show will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Horse Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the Santa Barbara National Horse Show against any and all loss, damage and liability thus occasioned including but not limited to any and all logal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of any entry form shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.
- ALL OWNERS AND EXHIBITORS will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them or their agents to barns or other properties on the Showgrounds and will be billed accordingly.
- 6. IN ADDITION TO ENTRIES of persons suspended or expelled from the Federation, the Recognized competition may refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer, rider, driver or handler who has shown an objectionable attitude towards this Recognized competition or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Recognized competition or to its management.
- MANAGEMENT reserves the right to cancel, consolidate or split classes depending upon entries received at closing date.
- 8. THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE reserves the privilege of substituting or changing judges if it becomes necessary. The Judges' decision in the show ring are their own responsibility and the Show Committee accepts no responsibility for these decisions.
- 9. PROTESTS. Please refer to GR 603 for complete rule.
- 10. ENTRIES CLOSE AND MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN THURSDAY. JUNE 16. ENTRIES POSTMARKED BY DUE DATE WILL RECEIVE A \$5.00 CREDIT PER HORSE ON THEIR ACCOUNT. NO ENTRIES, SUBSTITUTIONS, OR CLASS CHANGES WILL BE TAKEN OVER THE TELEPHONE. NO ENTRY IS VALID UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK OR CREDIT CARD INFORMATION.

11. REFUNDS. Full refunds will be given if written notice is received by the Show Secretary before the closing of entries. Exhibitors scratching a horse for any reason after the official closing date shall forfeit all entry, stall and association fees, UNLESS a valid Veterinarian's or Doctor's certificate of disability for entered horse/rider is submitted to the Horse Show Secretary PRIOR to the first event of the horse show, in which case a \$30.00 fee will be assessed. If illness or injury after the start of the show should prevent exhibitor's participation in the balance of entered classes, a refund of unused class fees will be made, less a \$30.00 fee, providing the balance of classes are officially scratched and a doctor's certificate is provided within 48 hours of the close of the show. Stall and association fees will not be refunded.

# 12. ADDS AND SCRATCHES There will be no fee for adds and scratches. AN OPEN, SIGNED CHECK MUST BE ON FILE WITH THE SHOW SECRETARY TO COVER THESE ADDITIONAL FEES AND OTHER INCIDENTALS.

- 13. PENALTY. There will be a penalty of \$50.00 if a check or credit card is refused for any reason. No checks will be processed through the bank a second time, and must be covered by a money order, cashiers check, cash or credit card, in addition to the penalty.
- 14. NUMBERS. No competition numbers will be released by the Horse Show Office until all entry blanks are complete, all necessary copies of registration papers, USEF membership cards and measurement cards have been seen, and all fees have been paid with a check or credit card. EXHIBITORS MUST ALSO PROVIDE AN OPEN CHECK TO COVER ANY EXPENSES THAT MIGHT BE INCURRED BY THEM DURING THE COURSE OF THE SHOW, INCLUDING FEED AND BEDDING.
- 15. R.D.N.E Any horse or rider showing in a class that they did not enter will be charged a \$10 Rode-Did-Not-Enter penalty, plus the class entry fee.
- 16. STABLING. All stalls are approximately 10' by 10', of wood construction with top and bottom doors. STALLS WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM 8:00 AM ON TUESDAY, JULY 5 AND MUST BE VACATED NO LATER THAN NOON ON SUNDAY, JULY 10. NO FIRST BEDDING WILL BE FURNISHED. Early arrivals will be charged @ \$20.00 per day, per stall.
- FEED AND BEDDING. NO FIRST BEDDING will be provided. Either straw or shavings can be used for bedding purposes. Exhibitors must leave an open check with the horse show office, payable to the 19<sup>th</sup> D.A.A. TO ORDER AHEAD, please call La Cumbre Feed at (805) 687-1880.
- 18. TRAINERS wishing to split the payment of their tack rooms and feed/bedding must fill out forms provided by the horse show office, no later than Thursday, July 7.
- **19.** FOOTING in all arenas is a combination of sand, dirt, shavings and inorganic material. Arenas are 125' x 250'.
- 20. DOGS and ALL OTHER PETS must be on leashes at all times. Stray animals will be impounded and removed from the grounds.
- 21. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devises for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- 22. All juniors in the Welsh division, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

- 23. THE RATED SECTIONS of this competition are official point competitions for the USEF National and USEF Zone 10 Horse of the Year Awards Program.
- 24. USEF MEMBERSHIP. Every owner, trainer, rider, driver and handler must present a current USEF membership card or copy thereof, or pay a \$30.00 non-refundable Show Pass Fee.
- 25. USEF AMATEUR CERTIFICATION. Any exhibitor entered in an "Amateur to Ride" class must possess a current USEF Amateur certification and present same at Horse Show Office before numbers can be picked up.
- 26. ASHA Membership required of all Owners, Trainers, Riders, Drivers and Handlers in the Saddlehorse Division.
- 27. PARKING. Fire regulations prohibit exhibitor vehicles including cars, trailers, vans and campers from being parked in barn areas. Designated parking will be posted. There will be no exceptions and violators will be towed away at owner's expense.
- PRIZE MONEY CHECKS will be sent by mail within thirty days of the conclusion of the show.

The gait may technically be described as the simultaneous but asynchronous motion of the same side of the body followed by the movement of the legs on the opposite side. The gait is initiated by the hind leg. The length of the stride for both hind and fore legs should be nearly equal. The Rocky Mountain Horse moves his feet with minimal ground clearance and minimal knee and hock action.

- ELIGIBILITY: All Ponies, Cobs, Half-Welsh and Partbreds must be registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc., the WPCSA, the WPCSC, or, if under one year, must be eligible for registration. Only animals registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc. will receive points. An animal must be shown under its full registered Welsh number and name. Before an animal is issued a number or enters the ring, the Show Secretary must have a copy of the Welsh Certificate of Registration in the current owner's name. If the animal is under one year and not yet registered, submit a copy of the dam's Certificate of Registration, the registration number and registered name of the sire and the proposed registration name of entry. Unnamed foals may not be shown. A breeding pony may not be shown in both Section C and Section D classes during the same year. All leases are designated as such on animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.
- ENTRIES: Copy of both sides of the Registration papers and a current measurement card <u>MUST</u> accompany each entry. Exhibitor numbers will not be assigned until <u>ALL</u> paperwork is in order and any measuring has occurred.
- MEASUREMENT: All halter animals 6 years and over, and all performance animals <u>MUST</u> present a copy of a USEF permanent measurement card or a USEF measurement conducted during the current competition year, or be measured at the show. Measurement to occur on Wednesday, July 6<sup>th</sup> between NOON and 5 PM and on Thursday, July 7<sup>th</sup> and Friday, July 8<sup>th</sup> between 7 AM and 9 AM. <u>MEASUREMENT FORMS AVAILABLE IN SHOW OFFICE</u>. Halter entries will be measured first. OWNER OF ANIMAL TO BE MEASURED MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE USEF OR PAY MEMBERSHIP FEE AT THE SHOW. THERE IS NO CHARGE FOR MEASUREMENT.

#### 4. JUNIORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO SHOW STALLIONS

- 5. **DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Except in hunter divisions, ties will be settled by the flip of a coin. In the hunter divisions, the Championship or Reserve will be awarded to the animal that scores the highest in the over fence classes.
- 6. SAFETY FIRST: For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitching, anywhere on the Showgrounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the Showgrounds. See helmet rule on page 8, section 22.

**WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)** Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh and Partbreds to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

**WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)** To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4) To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. To be judged 65% on performance with emphasis on manners; 25% on breed type, movement and conformation; 10% on appointments. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

**WPCSA WELSH HUNTER (Article 112.5)** Over fences (o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0", animals exceeding 13.2 hands shall jump 2'6". Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony/cob must have shown in and completed an over fence class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be required to gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6) Division is open to riders 12 years and under mounted on ponies, cobs, hallf–Welsh and parttbred, mares and geldings. <u>RIDERS</u> in this division (including the under-saddle class) may not compete over fences in any other division except short stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Animals may either trot or canter the entire course. Over-fences classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, animal must have shown in and completed an over-fences class. Under-saddle class animals will be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Not required to jog for over-fences classes.

WPCSA LONG STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.7) – Ages 13 & Over Classes are open to all ponies, cobs, half-Welsh and partbreds. <u>RIDERS</u> in this division may not compete in any other division at that show where the fences exceed 18" with the exception of Low Hunters. There are no restrictions for animals exhibiting in these classes. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences and 8 jumping efforts. Over-fence classes to precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. May trot or canter the course. Not required to jog for over-fences classes.

WPCSA LOW HUNTER (Article 112.8) Classes open to all ponies, cobs, half-Welsh and partbreds. This division is open to juniors and adults. <u>ANIMALS</u> in this division, including the under-saddle, may not compete over fences in any other division at that show where the fences exceed 18". There are no restrictions riders exhibiting in these classes. Course to have a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts. Show management may offer the division either as 18" only or a choice of 18" or 2'. If a choice of 18" or 2' is given, the jumps must be verticals (no crossrails). No animal may jump both 18" or 2' in this class at the same show. Fence heights are not determined by the height of the animal. Over-fence classes to precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. May trot or canter the course. Not required to jog for the over-fence classes,

#### WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Art icle 113.1)

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. Use of a bike style vehicle with floorboards and a basket is acceptable. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, to back readily. A properly attired groom or passengers capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency is required for all pairs and tandems; unicorns or 4 in hand require 2 grooms/passengers. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING (Article 113.2 and 113.2.1) Classes open to all ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbreds. Welsh Carriage Driving division will consist of three classes, one turnout, one working and one obstacle, or a combination thereof, but at least one class must be on the rail. Also see Article 116.7. Reinsmanship and article 116.8 Carriage Driving Freestyle Reinsmanship which are not pointed for WPCSA purposes but are being considered as USEF new rule changes.

General Wire wheeled vehicles may be used. General rules are the same as Welsh Pleasure Driving except where noted. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. In the slow trot the animal should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. The trot is slower and more collected, but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. However, the animal should indicate willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING TURNOUT (Article 113.2.3) To be judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING WORKING (Article 113.2.3) To be judged primarily on the suitability of the animal to provide a pleasure drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly both on the rail and while in lineup and, except for tandems, to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire

WPCSA OBSTACLE/CONES DRIVING (Article 113.2.3) Course plan must be announced and posted one hour before competition is to begin. Competitors may walk the course. Martingales and overchecks are prohibited in obstacle classes for all vehicles. Side checks are optional. Failure to comply incurs elimination. Refer to specifications in rule book (Article 113.2.3) for the type of obstacle/cones classes being offered.

**WPCSA ROADSTER - 12.2 & Under (Article 113.4)** For Section A and B ponies 12.2 and under. Roadster must enter the ring clockwise at a jog-trot then show at the road gait, turn counter clockwise at the jog-trot, show at the road gait and then trot at speed. Must stand quietly while being judged in the line up. In the event of a workoff, entries chosen must work both ways of the ring, as the original routine. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, style and speed in form; 25% on breed type. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

**WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION (Article 114.1)** Division is open to riders 12 years & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh/partbred, mares and geldings. To be judged 100% on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount.

**Over Fences (o/f):** Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Animals may either trot or canter the course. The o/f class must precede the under saddle class.

**Under saddle (u/s):** Animals must walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. <u>RIDERS</u> entering these classes, including the under saddle class may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Hunter.

**WPCSA HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.4)** Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh and partbreds. To be judged on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount. Animals 13.2 and under jump 2'; animals over 13.2 jump 2.6".

Over Fence classes (o/f) to be shown over a minimum of six obstacles.

Under saddle classes (u/s) to be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Test may be required.

**WPCSA STOCK SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.5)** Classes are open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh and partbreds. Riders to be judged on seat, hands, performance of animal, appointments of animal and rider and suitability of animal to rider. Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog and are judged at the flat-footed four beat walk, two-beat jog and a three-beat lope both ways of the ring. All competitors are required to back a straight line during the line up. Tests may be required.

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1) Section A, B, C, H, or P, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least 4 but not more than 8 years of age. To be shown on light contact and led by an adult. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. To be shown at a walk, on the right rein (clockwise), to line up and stand quietly. Ponies will be called out individually to stand, walk out and trot or jog back past the judge. Ponies to be judged on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turn-out. This is not an equitation class. There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2) Section A, B, C, H, or P, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least 4 but not more than 10 years of age.s prior to the start of the class. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot/jog, both ways of the ring. Ponies to be judged on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going, suitability and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class. <u>There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.</u>

WPCSA TRAIL (Article 115.3) English or Western equipment. Open to A/B/C/D/H/P. Trail classes must be offered separately for juniors and adults. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance. Trail entries are required to work over and through obstacles. No animal may enter the trail course area until the course and judge are ready. Riders will be permitted to inspect the course on foot during the Judge's instruction. Tests which may be required are negotiating the gate, carrying objects from one part of the arena to another, riding through water, over logs or simulated brush, riding down into and up out of a ditch without lunging, crossing a bridge (no rocking or moving bridges permitted), backing through obstacles, sidepassing, mounting and dismounting from either side and performing over any reasonable conditions encountered along the trail. However, unnatural obstacles such as fire extinguishers, perforated plywood in water boxes, exotic animals or unsafe elements such as hay bales should be avoided. Courses to include a minimum of six obstacles and a maximum of eight obstacles except in the case of damaged obstacles. Juniors will not side pass or lope/canter over loose rails.

WPCSA LEADLINE CLASS SPECIFICATIONS (Article 115.4.1) In all Leadline classes, the leadline is to be attached to the cavesson on the English bridle and on the Western bridle to the check slot of the bit (top of bit). No chain leadlines allowed.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh or partbred mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. <u>Riders</u> ineligible for other ridden classes except costume and leading rein. No Championships for this Division. Year End participatory awards will be given of a high score award.

**WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT** (open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh or partbreds. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot/jog. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 and over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. See rules for attachment of leading rein. <u>Riders</u> ineligible for other ridden classes except costume and leadling rein, leadline walk, leadline walk-trot/jog and leadline walk/trot poles.

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh or partbreds. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. English or Western attire is acceptable. <u>Riders</u> ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot, walk-trot poles. To walk both ways of the ring.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh or partbreds. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible tests to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. <u>Riders</u> ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, walk-trot poles.

WPCSA JUNIOR WELSH HANDLER (Article 115.6) Judged on the ability and skill of the Junior in handling their pony/cob/half-Welsh or partbred as in the breed ring. The show qualities of the pony/cob/half-Welsh or partbreds shall not be considered, although cleanliness and grooming can be considered. Exhibitors enter to the left so as not to obscure the judge's view. The judge evaluates the ability of the junior to follow directions, use space wisely, and execute the requested patterns. Juniors should appear "ring wise", be alert to the judging progression and be prepared for changes in the judging routine.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. C & D (Article 115.7)\*\* This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Hunt Seat attire only. No western, saddle seat or side saddle tack or attire. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. A & B (Article 115.7)\*\* This class is for registered Section A and B ponies, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Hunt Seat attire only. No western, saddle seat or side saddle tack or attire. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP (Article 115.8)\*\*\* To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on ridden performance. Open to the first and second place winners from the Ridden Welsh A/B Classic and the Ridden Welsh C/D Classic classes. There is no entry fee for this class. Places will be awarded for Best Ridden Welsh Classic and Reserve Best Ridden. Any animal in the class is eligible to be named Best Ridden. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. The judge shall request all four gaits (walk, trot, canter, gallop) in at least on direction but animals need not show in both directions. The judge shall consider the size of the ponies/cobs, ages of the riders and safety of arena when determining whether to have the animals perform as a group or individually. Individual pattern is optional at the judge's discretion. Entries shall not be stripped as conformation score from the qualifying class shall be carried forward.

#### NON-POINTED:

**WALK-TROT TRAIL (Article 116.6)** Open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh/partbreds, mares and geldings. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk and optional trot or jog. To be judged 100% on performance. Pattern will not include a side pass.

#### PRODUCE OF DAM – GET OF SIRE

Open to all sections. Animals must enter at least one (1) WPCSA halter class. Produce of Dam must have two (2) offsprings out of the same dam. Get of Sire must have three (3) offspring by the same sire.

**RANCH PONY PLEASURE (A/B/C/D/H/PB)** Ponies to be shown according to pattern (WPCSA approved or designed by judge according to class specifications), Ponies should perform required pattern at a forward working speed without excessive contact receiving a score of 0-100 with 70 being an average performance. The overall manners and responsiveness of the pony while performing are the primary considerations. This class is judged 100% on performance.
