Returned Check Policy: If a check is returned unpaid, the show will assess a \$25.00 fee and a money order, cashiers check or cash must be presented to show management. No premiums will be paid until all delinquent funds are collected.

Office hours:

Noon to 7:00 pm - Friday.

7:00 am to close of show - Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

Show Check-in Requirements: All equine will be accompanied with a record of a negative official test for EIA (Coggins) conducted within the past 12 months. You must present the original form and not a copy upon arrival. Foals less than 6 months of age, accompanied by and nursing a negative tested mare are exempt from the testing requirements. This is a state law and show management will check papers when you arrive and if proper documentation is not present, you will not be permitted to remain on the grounds.

Measurements: All Welsh which do not possess a valid measurement card will be measured as required by the official measurer. Measurement will be Friday 7-9 pm. Alternate times will be posted. It is the owner's responsibility to make a measurement time. Animals five (5) and under shown only in halter are not subject to measurement.

Stalls and Bedding: Arrangements for access to stalls prior to 8:00 am Friday must make arrangements with Denise Dougherty (cell phone: 580-402-6558) to get into the stalls. **All bedding is in-house.** See Expo Center Rules on page 3.

Prize monies will be mailed within 60 days following the show.

Sanctioning: This is a Provisional Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America (WPCSA) Double Gold Show. All WPCSA classes will conform to the class specifications, which are included herein. Welsh performance championships are based on points only, no entry fees are required for those classes. To qualify for entry in Stake classes, the exhibitor must enter and compete in at least one other class in the division.

Classes: Show management reserves the right, with permission of the exhibitors, to cancel classes that have no entries, or to divide the classes in which the entries cannot be accommodated in the ring at one time, and to make such changes in the class schedule as dictated by the interest of the show. If there are 8 or more 12.2 and under and 8 or more over 12.2 to 14.2 hand ponies in any WPCSA class, it will be split. Classes are open to stallions, mares and geldings. WPCSA classes of less than three entries will receive reduced points and will not be combined.

2 Rules & Regulations

Breed Specifications: *Section A Welsh Pony* - Not exceeding 12.2 hands
 Section B Welsh Pony - Not exceeding 14.2 hands
 Section C Welsh Pony of Cob Type - 13.2 hands & under
 Section D Welsh Cob - Over 13.2 hands
 Small Pony - 12.2 hands and under
 Medium/Large Pony - Over 12.2 hands, not exceeding 14.2 hands

Attire: Riders must be properly attired according to the rules of the division in which they are competing. Riders in all classes where jumping is required, and when jumping elsewhere on the show grounds, must wear protective headgear. Numbers must be worn and be clearly visible.

Adult Exhibitors: An individual who has reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year.

Junior Exhibitors: An individual who has not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year. When dividing junior divisions into two separate age groups, they will be split as follows: youth 12 & under and youth 13 and over (but have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. Juniors under 14 years of age cannot show a stallion. Junior Drivers under 14 years of age must have an experienced adult (over 18) in the carriage at all times. **Junior exhibitors must wear approved protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times while on the show ground. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.**

Area Motels: Comfort Inn, 1750 S. Lynn Riggs Blvd. 918-343-3297 and Microtel, 918-343-2868. Due to two other large events in the area, we were unable to secure a block of rooms at a special rate.

Facilities: Claremore Expo Center has a 135'x265' Indoor Dirt Arena with bleacher seating, a 120'x210' Covered Arena with attached stall barn. Access to Indoor Arena is by covered walkway.

Concessions: Concessions on the show grounds are open from 7:30am to 6pm.

R.V. Hook-ups: The facility RV Park has full hook-ups and on-site dry camping on a nightly fee basis. It also boasts amenities such as BBQ grills, picnic tables, showers and laundry service, and a playground. Contact RV Park Manager for information (918) 342-5357 ext. 200.

Super Rec Center: Located across from the RV Park, the Super Rec Center has an Olympic size swimming pool, walking track, basketball courts, etc.

Expo Center Rules

Parking: Parking in front and side of the barns is restricted due to fire safety regulations and to allow exhibitors to pass from the stabling area to the show arena safely. Vehicles parked in restricted areas are subject to towing.

Bedding: Shavings are \$7.00 per bag (price subject to change based on the cost and availability of shavings.) One bag minimum is required with stall rental. ***Absolutely No Outside Bedding Allowed.***

Dog Policy: No dogs shall be allowed into the facility, except for those certified to assist the physically challenged. Only dogs on leashes shall be allowed in the exercise area or stall barn area.

Stalling: All animals entered or brought to events would ideally be stalled in the livestock facilities. No Jump-offs allowed. A minimum of one bag of bedding shall be required per stall. Barns and stalls are for the use of contracted facility events only.

No Taping, tacking stapling, nailing, gluing etc. on walls or other painted surfaces.

Smoking: The facility is a smoke-free facility. This includes the Exhibit Hall, Arena and Horse Barn. No smoking is allowed inside the buildings. Designated smoking sections are stationed outside the facilities.

Rules / Class Specifications 3

LIVESTOCK ANIMALS AND INHERENT RISK Persons engaged in livestock activities on the Claremore EXPO CENTER premises assume all risks associated with the inherent in the participation of such activities. The Claremore Cultural Development Authority and/or The city of Claremore shall not be responsible in any manner for injuries and/or damages, either seen or unforeseen, sustained by any person engaged in livestock activities on said premises as provided for under Oklahoma Law.

Class Specifications

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2) Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh and Part Breds to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

offered in both Shows

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3) To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25 % on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

offered in both Shows

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4) To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without a martingale, on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; breed type, conformation and movement 25%; appointments 10%. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA WELSH HUNTER (Article 112.5) To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'.0"; animals exceeding 13.2 shall jump 2'6". Over fences (o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of **six** fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height. Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fence class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to hand gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

offered in both Shows

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6) Division is open to riders 12 years & under. Classes are open to all Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Bred, mares and geldings. **RIDERS** in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the course. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, animal must have shown in **and completed** an over-fences class. Under-saddle class animals will be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Not required to jog for over-fences classes.

offered in both Shows

WPCSA LOW HUNTER 18" or 2' (Article 112.8) Division is open to Ponies/Cobs and Half-Welsh/Part Breds, Juniors and Adults. These **ANIMALS** may not compete in any other over fences division at that show where fence heights exceed 18". There are no restrictions on the rider unless they are restricted by other class rules. Long Stirrup riders are eligible if jumping 18" but Short Stirrup riders are not eligible to compete. Courses to be set at 18" or 2' with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Jumps must be verticals (no cross rails). Riders may choose to jump 18" or 2'. Fence heights are not determined by the height of the animal. No animal may jump both 18" and 2" in this division at the same show. Over-fences classes must precede the under-saddle classes. To be judged 100% on performance. May either trot or canter the course. Not required to jog for over-fences classes.

WPCSA HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3) Classes open to Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds. To be judged on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control and of their mount. Animals 13.2 and under jump 2'; animals over 13.2 jump 2'6". Over-fences (o/f) classes: to be shown over a minimum of six obstacles. Under-saddle (u/s) classes: To be shown at walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Tests may be required.

4 Class Specifications

Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1) To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroi, racing sulky or fine harness rig. Use of a bike style vehicle with floorboards and a basket is acceptable. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily**. A properly attired groom or passenger *capable of rendering assistance in case of emergency* is required for all pairs and tandems; unicorns and four-in-hands require 2 grooms/passengers. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

offered in both Shows

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING (Article 113.2) (wire-wheeled vehicles may be used at this show) Classes open to Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. In the slow trot the animal should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. A properly attired groom or passenger *capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency* is required for all pairs and tandems; unicorns and four-in-hands require 2 grooms/passengers. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class.

offered in both Shows

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING TURNOUT (Article 113.2.3) To be judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression: 30% on performance, manners and way of going.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING WORKING (Article 113.2.3) To be judged primarily on the suitability of the animal to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. May be asked to execute appropriate tests. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

WPCSA OBSTACLE/CONES DRIVING (Article 113.2.3) Obstacle/Cones to be judged 100% on performance. Course plan must be announced and posted one hour before competition is to begin. Competitors may walk the course. Martingales and overchecks are prohibited in obstacle classes for all vehicles. Side checks are optional. Failure to comply incurs elimination. Refer to specifications in rule book (Article 113.2.3) for the type of obstacle/cones classes being offered.

WPCSA Obstacle - Time Competition

Not to exceed 20 obstacles (pairs of cones topped with tennis balls). Faults add seconds to total time. Fastest time wins.

1. To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.
2. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line.
3. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off (unless otherwise stated in the prize list).
4. Penalties:
 - a) Exceeding time allowed (every commenced second) 0.5 second
 - b) Knocking over start or finish marker 5 seconds
 - c) Knocking down or dislodging obstacle 5 seconds
 - d) Break in gait, if not allowed
 - 1st break from trot 5 seconds
 - 2nd break from trot 5 seconds
 - 3rd break from trot 5 seconds
 - 4th break from trot Elimination
 - Prolonged canter or walk Elimination
 - e) Disobedience and/or groom dismounting (cumulative over course)
 - 1st incident 5 seconds
 - 2nd incident 10 seconds
 - 3rd incident Elimination
 - f) Starting before signal Elimination

- g) Failure to cross starting line within one minute of signal Elimination
- h) Off course Elimination
- i) Exceeding time limit (2X time allowed) Elimination
- j) Outside assistance Elimination
- k) Failure to carry whip Elimination
- l) Use of a tie-down or overcheck Elimination
- m) Breakage of harness or vehicle Elimination

Article 115.4.1 LEADLINE CLASS SPECIFICATIONS In all Leadline classes the leadline is to be attached to the cavesson on the English bridle and on the Western bridle to the cheek slot of the bit (top of the bit). No chain leadlines allowed.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1) Section A, B, C or Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than eight, years of age. To be shown on light contact and led by an adult. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. To be shown at a walk, on the right rein (clockwise), to line up and stand quietly Ponies to be called out individually to stand, walk out, and trot or jog back past the judge. **Ponies to be judged** on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turn-out. This is not an equitation class. **There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.**

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2) Section A, B, C, Half-Welsh or Part Bred, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but no more than 10, years of age. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot or jog, both ways of the ring. **Ponies to be judged** on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going, manners, suitability and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class. **There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.**

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA TRAIL (Article 115.3) Open to all Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds. Junior and adult (separate divisions are to be offered for juniors and adults). English or Western equipment. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance.

offered in Show #2 only

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4) Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mares and geldings. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot, and leadline walk-trot poles.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4) Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mares and geldings. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot/jog. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot poles.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot and walk-trot poles. To walk both ways of the ring.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot poles.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of

4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot.

offered in Show #1 only

WPCSA JUNIOR WELSH HANDLER (Article 115.6) Class open to juniors handling Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds mares and geldings. Judged on the ability and skill of the Junior in handling their animal as in the breed ring. The show qualities of the animal shall not be considered, although cleanliness and grooming can be considered. Exhibitors enter to the left so as not to obscure the judge's view. The judge evaluates the ability of the junior to follow directions, use space wisely, and execute the requested patterns. Juniors should appear "ring wise", be alert to the judging progression and be prepared for changes in the judging routine.

offered in Show #2 only

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. C & D (Article 115.7) This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on performance. Entries shall enter the arena in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot, and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation judging, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Class is an English class only. No Western, Saddle Seat or Side Saddle tack or attire. Qualified UK or American Judge to officiate.

offered in Show #2 only

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. A & B (Article 115.7) This class is for registered Welsh Ponies, Section A & B, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on performance. Entries shall enter the arena in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot, and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation judging, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Class is an English class only. No Western, Saddle Seat or Side Saddle tack or attire. Qualified UK or American Judge to officiate.

offered in Show #2 only

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS (Article 115.7) To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on ridden performance. Open to first and second place winners from Ridden Welsh A/B Classic and the Ridden Welsh C/D Classic. There is no entry fee for this class. Places will be awarded for the Best Ridden and the Reserve Best Ridden. Any animal in this class is eligible to be named the Best Ridden. Entries shall enter the arena in a clockwise direction. The Judge shall request all four gaits (walk, trot, canter, gallop) in at least one direction, but animals need not show in both directions. The judge shall consider the size of the ponies/cobs, ages of riders, safety of arena when determining whether to have the animals perform as a group or individually. Individual pattern is optional at the judge's discretion. Entries shall not be stripped as conformation score from the qualifying class shall be carried forward.

offered in Show #2 only

WPCSA WALK-TROT ADULT EQUITATION (Article 115.8) Class open to riders 18 years of age and older on ponies, cobs, Half-Welsh or Part Breds. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for any other WPCSA pointed ridden class at that show. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. Possible tests to include: walk, trot or jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked.

offered in Show #1 only

NON-POINTED CLASSES

WALK-TROT TRAIL (Article 116.6) Open to riders 11 & under mounted on Ponies/Cobs/Half-Welsh/Part Breds, mares and geldings. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance. Pattern will not include a side pass or loping/cantering over loose rails.

offered in Show #2 only

PET PONY OBSTACLE Safety is a primary concern and suitability of child to pony will be emphasized. Child will lead pony over and around obstacles demonstrating their ability to control and maneuver the pony in a safe manner. Attire is not to be considered in judging unless considered unsafe. Adults or older juniors may accompany child and pony in the ring.

OBSTACLE/CONES UNDER SADDLE - TIMED COMPETITION Open to any age rider on ponies, cobs, Half-Welsh or Part Breds. English or Western tack is acceptable. 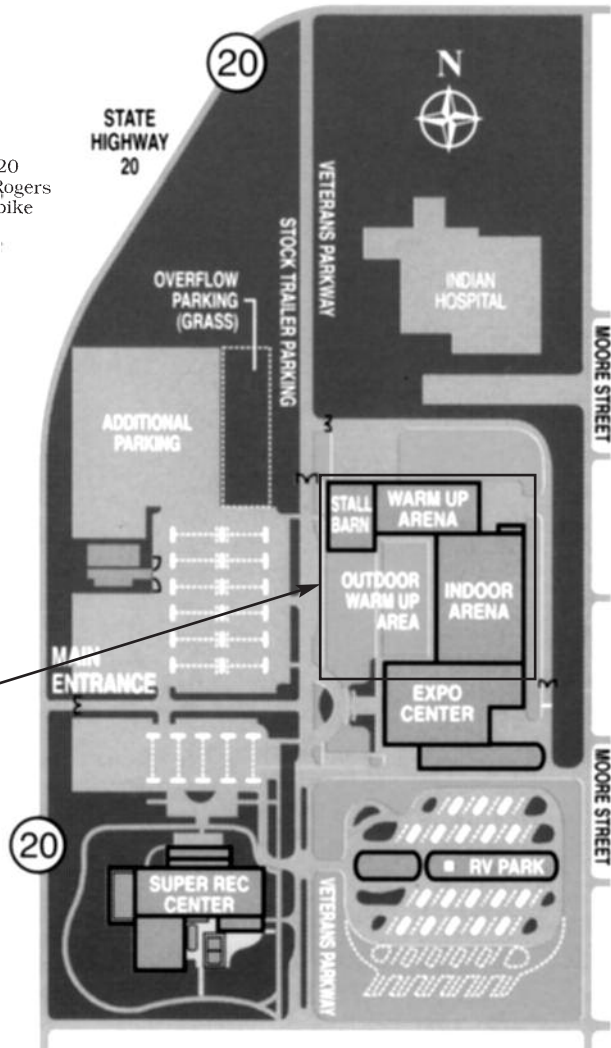
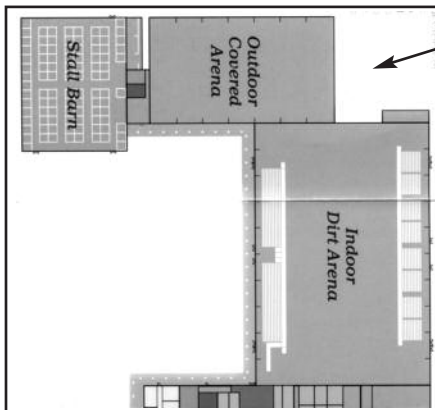
