Directions to Highlander Ranch:

From I-35 and Lake Shore/TX Loop 340/TX FM 3051: Head West to Lake Shore Drive. At light, turn right onto Steinbeck Bend Drive (FM 3051). At light, turn right onto Rock Creek Road. Turn right onto Cobbs Lane (Be careful not to GPS Cobbs Drive). The gate is the first on your left. Ranch gates close at 8:00 p.m.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS**In addition to the General Rules of the WPCSA**

This show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America. Each participant in this show is responsible for the knowledge of and is subject to these rules.

1. Eligibility: All Ponies/Cobs must be registered in the studbook of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America, or, if under one year, be eligible for registration. A Pony/Cob must be shown under its full registered Welsh name and number. All lease agreements must be officially recorded through the Society office. All recorded leases are designated as such on the animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.

2. Payment of Fees: Only cash, check or Money Orders payable in US Currency will be accepted. Fees must be paid in full with paper work and signatures complete **before numbers will be issued**. A completed and signed check must accompany entries. Returned checks will be subject to a \$25 fee and must be cleared within 30 days of the last day of the show, or disciplinary actions will be sought through the WPCSA.

Refund Policy: No refunds will be given unless a class is canceled, or upon presentation of a Vet Certificate/Doctor's note and notification to the Show Secretary before the start of the show. The Show Committee's discretion will be used in other instances. Decisions of Show Management are final.

3. Height and Measurement: All halter animals 8 years and over, and all performance animals must present a copy of a WPCSA or USEF permanent measurement card or measurement conducted during the current competition year, or be measured before getting your numbers to show. Measurement to take place at 8 AM on the day of the show. All performance ponies must have a measurement card.

4. Exhibitors, parents and/or guardians of minor exhibitors shall indemnify and hold harmless WPCSA, Double B Equestrian Center, Red River Welsh Pony Association, employees and/or all horse show officials and employees or volunteers from any and all liability resulting in injury and/or loss sustained by any person, child or ward of such parent/guardian, in any manner occasioned.

5. **Entries:** Copy of BOTH sides of the registration papers MUST accompany each entry. If you have a current measurement card, include a copy of it. Exhibitor numbers will not be issued until ALL paperwork is in order, and any measuring required has been completed. PLEASE take the time to fill out your entry form correctly and completely. Entries must be postmarked by March 14, 2016 or Post-entry office charge will apply.

6. **Stalls** – Stalls are available for \$35 per night. Stall fee includes 2 bags shavings. **NO OUTSIDE SHAVINGS ALLOWED.**

Class fees are as follows:

- Breeding classes \$30.00
- Performance Classes WPCSA/Open \$15.00
- WPCSA recording fee, per judge \$5.00
- Office Fee, Per Owner, \$10.00
- WPCSA Measurement Fee for non-WPCSA members (each animal) \$5
- Post-Entry Fee-one time charge double the office fee, then class fees as above
- Stalls - \$35.00 per night – includes 2 bags of shavings – **NO OUTSIDE SHAVINGS ALLOWED**
- Shavings - \$8.00 – **No Outside Shavings Allowed**

7. **Prize Money:** \$10 will be awarded to each Judge's Champion Section A, Section B, Section C/D, Champion Gelding and Half-Welsh/Partbred.

Stake Classes: To qualify for entry, exhibitors must enter and compete in at least one other class in the division. All stake/jackpot classes will pay \$10 to first place, \$5 to second place. Classes with less than 3 entries do not pay out Stake money. Any divisions that are not filled (3 entries in all 3 classes) will not be awarded Championships.

8. **Ribbons:** Ribbons for 1-6th place will be awarded. Champion and Reserve Champion in all divisions will receive rosettes. Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion will receive a neck sash.

9. **Driving:** For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds. A properly attired groom or passenger is required for all pairs, tandems, unicorns or 4 in hand, capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the competition.

10. **All riders in any class where jumping is required and/or when jumping anywhere on the show grounds, must wear protective headgear.** Anyone violating this rule will be prohibited from further riding until in compliance.

NOTE: Protective headgear is advised and welcome in all classes of any age group, with no judging penalties.

11. **Junior exhibitors must wear approved protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times while on the show ground. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.**

12. **All dogs must be on leash or secured at all times.**

13. Juniors under the age of 14 are not allowed to show Stallions.

14. **ANY** abuse toward any animal or Show Official/Staff will be cause for immediate ejection from the show and premises, **WITHOUT REFUND.**

15. Management reserves unto itself the right to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify riders, drivers or exhibitors without incurring claim for damages. Classes will be split where entries warrant. Decisions of the Show Management are final.

16. Two (2) Minute Gate Rule: To be strictly enforced. Additional three (3) minutes will be allowed for requested tack change. The Gate will not be held for more than five (5) minutes.

17. Please fill in your entry forms as completely as possible, including exhibitor's Date of Birth (juniors) and WPCSA owner numbers. This is especially important for tracking your pony's points by WPCSA. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Class Specifications

WPCSA JUNIOR WELSH HANDLER (Article 115.6)

Judged on the ability and skill of the Junior in handling their pony/cob/half-Welsh/Partbred as in the breed ring. The show qualities of the pony/cob/half-Welsh shall not be considered, although cleanliness and grooming can be considered. Exhibitors enter to the left so as not to obscure the judge's view. The judge evaluates the ability of the junior to follow directions, use space wisely, and execute the requested patterns. Juniors should appear "ring wise", be alert to the judging progression 6

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-/partbred Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred mares and geldings. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred mares and geldings. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot/jog. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred mares and geldings. See rules for attachment of leading rein. No chain leadlines allowed. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of 4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot.

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot and walk-trot poles. To walk both ways of the ring.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of 4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot.

WPCSA TRAIL (Article 115.3) Open to all ponies/cob/Half-Welsh/Partbred. English or Western equipment. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance.

OPEN PET PONY OBSTACLE-Open to all ponies and breeds- To be shown in-hand over and through obstacles at a walk and trot, by handlers 8 and under. To be judged 100% on performance.

OPEN IN-HAND TRAIL-Open to all breeds of horses and ponies, as well as handlers of all ages! To be shown in-hand over and through obstacles at a walk and trot. To be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1)

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. Use of a bike style vehicle with floorboards and a basket is acceptable. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily**. A properly attired groom or passenger *capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency* is required for all pairs and tandems; unicorns and four-in-hands require 2 grooms/passengers. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

HUNTER WARM-UP: Not rated. Fences heights not over 18".

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6)

Division is open to riders 12 years and under. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/half-/Partbred Welsh, mares and geldings. **RIDERS** in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the course. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, animal must have shown in **and completed** an over-fences class. Under-saddle class animals will be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Not required to jog for over-fences classes.

WPCSA LOW HUNTER 18" or 2' (Article 112.8)

Division is open to ponies/cobs and Half-Welsh/Partbreds, Juniors and Adults. These **ANIMALS** may not compete in any other over fences division at that show where fence heights exceed 18". There are no restrictions on the rider unless they are restricted by other class rules. Long Stirrup riders are eligible if jumping 18" but Short Stirrup riders are not eligible to compete. Courses to be set at 18" or 2' with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Jumps must be verticals (no cross rails). Riders may choose to jump 18" or 2'. Fence heights are not determined by the height of the animal. No animal may jump both 18" and 2' in this division at the same show. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle classes. To be judged 100% on performance. May either trot or canter the course. Not required to jog for over-fences classes.

WPCSA HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3)

Classes open to ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh/Partbred. To be judged on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount. Animals 13.2 and under jump 2" animals over 13.2 jump 2'6".

Under saddle (u/s) classes: to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Tests may be required.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. A&B (Article 115.7)

This class is for registered Welsh Ponies, Section A & B, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on performance. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot, and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation judging, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Class is an English class only. No Western, Saddle Seat or Side Saddle tack or attire. Qualified UK or American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. C & D (Article 115.7)

This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on performance. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot, and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation judging, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Class is an English class only. No Western, Saddle Seat or Side Saddle tack or attire. Qualified UK or American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS (Article 115.7) *.**

To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on ridden performance. Open to first and second place winners from the Ridden Welsh A/B Classic and the Ridden Welsh C/D Classic. There is no entry fee for this class. Places will be awarded for the Best Ridden and the Reserve Best Ridden. Any animal in this class is eligible to be named the Best Ridden. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. The Judge shall request all four gaits (walk, trot, canter, gallop) in at least one direction, but animals need not show in both directions. The judge shall consider the size of the ponies/cobs, ages of riders, safety of arena when determining whether to have the animals perform as a group or individually. Individual pattern is optional at the judge's discretion. Entries shall not be stripped as conformation score from the qualifying class shall be carried forward.

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25 % on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4)

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without a martingale, on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; breed type, conformation and movement 25%; appointments 10%. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA STOCK SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.5)

Classes are open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders to be judged on seat, hands, performance of animal, appointments of animal and rider and suitability of animal to rider. Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog and are judged at a flat-footed four beat walk, two-beat jog and a three-beat lope both ways of the ring. All competitors are required to back a straight line during the line up. Tests may be required.

WPCSA WALK-TROT ADULT EQUITATION (Article 115.8)

Class open to riders 18 years of age and older on ponies, cobs, Half-Welsh, or Part Breds. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for any other WPCSA pointed ridden class at that show. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. Possible tests to include: walk, trot or jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked.

LIBERTY CLASS RULES

LIBERTY training to the best performance is not a discipline that means a pony is just let loose in the ring with one or two persons chasing, or scaring the pony to go around the ring to music. It is a performance to perfectly selected music. Ponies/ horses by nature are beauty in movement. Training for this particular discipline will display that freedom of motion/training in trotting, loping, turning, animation, stopping on command (the pony loves performing LIBERTY) are elements that go into a good performance.

The following elements the pony will be judged on, along with the points for each:

Music	10 points
Style	10 points
Grace	10 points
Animation	15 points
Gaits	15 points
Presence	15 points
Use of ring	15 points
Ease of Catch	10 points
total	100 points

There is a maximum of 2 minutes of music, with 90 seconds of music preferred.

Two individuals are allowed in the ring with the pony, they are allowed noise makers and whips for sound.

As a judge, I prefer to not see those objects being used, then I know the pony has had some training and loves what he/she is doing and is not being scared into moving out and around.

I don't take off points with those "aids", my points are derived from the list above. Only one handler going into the ring does convey to the judge that this pony has been worked for this performance. Of course two handlers could have also trained the pony and two are allowed in the ring. The proof of training the pony will show in the pony's performance. All three gaits will be expected, in each direction. I love to see a pony/ horse in a Liberty class, enjoying their fluid motion.

The music starts as soon as the halter come off the pony and when it stops the primary handler (the handler that first removed the halter) has 2 minutes to put the halter on and end the performance..
